4. First aid measures

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5. Fire-fighting measures

6. Accidental release measures

Personal precautions

Environmental precautions

Methods for cleaning up

Small spill

Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible, absorbent material e.g. sand, earth, vermiculite or diatomaceous earth and place in container for disposal according to local regulations (see Section 13). 7. Handling and storage

Handling

: Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Eating, drinking and smoking should be prohibited in areas where this material is handled, stored and processed. Storage


